In EYFS, children get free fruit daily which we eat during our class snack time. We also provide a milk carton for each child up until they are 5

years of age.

Children are encouraged to bring a bottle of water with them to school, however we do provide a jug of water at our snack table.




PE

Class A PE day is on a Friday. Class B PE day is a Thursday.

For the first few weeks we will be going to the hall in our uniforms to play some games. Towards the end of term we will be expecting children to start getting changed into their kits.

So that the children get plenty of time during their session please have a go at practising getting changed independently at home. Please ensure kits are in school on a Monday, they can then be left in school for the half term.

Children need black or navy shorts and a white t-shirt for indoor P.E. They will need to be labelled with their names so that they do not get mixed up with other children's clothes (including shoes).



Please ensure that all of your child's belongings are labelled with their name to avoid anything being lost.





















Homework

Homework will be given out each Monday and will be stuck into homework books. Children will have one piece of Maths and one piece of Phonics homework each week which will revise the content taught in school the previous week.

Reading at home will continue to be a priority as part of the homework package. Please read with your child each day at home and record this in their reading diary.

Books will be changed on a Monday and Thursday.
