School Uniform

Dear Mums, Dads & Carers,

In readiness for next academic year, please see below options for sourcing reasonably priced school uniform.

We will promote wider options on our school Facebook page as they are brought to the school attention e.g. which stores have special offers on for 2024. If you know of any further, please do let a member of the office team know.

- We are encouraging families to visit Farplace Animal Rescue in Ankerside Centre, as they will have affordable, nearly new, second hand school uniform, this including Moorgate Logo items too. We will be working with them closely next academic year by having one of their 'drop' boxes on site for donating items. We will share more information on this partnership in September.
- Tamworth Town Hall will be hosting a free uniform exchange Friday 2nd August between 2-4pm, where you can drop off any reusable school uniform. The Market stall will then be open on the Saturday 3rd August for completely free uniform collection. For further information, visit '**Tamworth Free Uniform Exchange**' on Facebook.
- Within our school community room, we have a small collection of nearly new items available to collect as and when families need them. Clothes are kept in age-labelled draws for you to help yourselves to throughout the school year.

As a reminder, please see our uniform expectations below.

Moorgate's School Uniform Policies states:

- **Red jumper, cardigan or fleece**
- **White polo shirt or shirt**
- **Black/grey trousers or skirt**
- **Black, sensible, low-heeled shoes**
- **Plain black, grey or white socks/tights**
- **Tailored knee-length shorts**
- **Red summer dress**

Jogging bottoms/shorts & cycling shorts should only be worn as part of a PE kit and not everyday school uniform. The exception to this is our nursery children for ease of nappy changing.

Hairstyles should be neat and tidy and promote our high standards of dress. Long hair should be off the face in all lessons and fully tied back for PE. Children may be sent home to rectify unsuitable hairstyles. We encourage there to be no extremes of style or colour and no shaved lines or patterns. Where possible hair accessories should be discreet and plain.

Jewellery including chains or necklaces should be not be worn in school. Earrings must be plain studs and either removable during PE lessons or taped up prior to attending school.

To help reduce the amount of lost property we kindly ask that all items are clearly labelled. Lost property is kept within the community room and we encourage families to check there for any misplaced items.
